More than one million under evacuation as Hurricane Florence nears Carolinas

HOLDEN BEACH, N.C. (Reuters) - Florence, the most powerful storm to menace the U.S. mainland this year, intensified into a Category 4 hurricane as it howled closer to the Carolinas on Monday, prompting evacuations of more than 1 million people to higher ground.

Packing maximum sustained winds of 130 miles per hour (209 kph), the storm was due to gain even greater strength before making landfall early on Thursday, bringing heavy rains with the potential to unleash widespread, severe flooding, according to the National Hurricane Center (NHC) in Miami.

"Florence is expected to be an extremely dangerous major hurricane through Thursday," the NHC said in a bulletin. Maps of the storm's trajectory showed it likely to come ashore

somewhere near the border of North Carolina and South Carolina. The governors of both states declared states of emergency. "We do not want to risk one South Carolina life in this hurricane," Governor Henry McMaster told a news conference. He estimated about 1 million residents would flee the coast of his state, following earlier orders for the evacuation of more than 50,000 people from the southern-most Outer Banks barrier islands of North Carolina. An estimated 250,000 more people from the northern Outer Banks were due to be sent to higher ground starting Tuesday at midday.

"We are in the bull's-eye," North Carolina Governor Roy Cooper said at a news conference. "This is going to be a statewide

Florence grew into a major hurricane on Monday morning and was upgraded again to a Category 4 on the five-step Saffir-Simpson scale of hurricane strength at midday as its top sustained wind speeds reached 130 mph. At that point the storm was centered about 1,170 miles (1,880 km) east-southeast of Cape Fear, North Carolina, the NHC said.

The \$200 billion of Chinese goods on the U.S. list includes some consumer products such as cameras and recording devices, luggage, handbags, tires and vacuum cleaners, with additional tariffs ranging from 10 to 25 percent. The best colleges in Texas for 2019

U.S. News & World Report's latest ranking of America's best colleges include dozens of Texas schools, including Rice University, University of Houston and Texas A&M.

With Monday's release, U.S. News has changed some major factors that determine how America's being selective. top schools were ranked.

For starters, researchers added a new metric, social mobility indicators, which measures how successfully colleges enroll and graduate students from low-income families.

"A university is not successful if it does not graduate its students, which is why the Best Colleges rankings place the greatest value on outcomes, including graduation and retention rates," said U.S. News' chief data strategist Robert Morse in a prepared statement. "By including social mobility indicators, U.S. News is further recognizing colleges that serve all of their students, regardless of economic status."

This year's rankings also ignore acceptance rates, putting more focus on the outcome of students rather than the number accepted at an institution. In other words, tough-to-getinto universities are no longer rewarded for

Despite the big changes, the list of America's best universities had some familiar names.

The top five national universities were:

- 3. Columbia University (N.Y.) (tie)
- 3. Massachusetts Institute of Technology (tie)

Gasoline prices headed for post-summer decline

APrices at the pump fell by almost 2 cents a gallon last week, but more relief should be on the way as refineries soon make the switch to cheaper winter-grade fuels.

Gasoline prices in the Houston area fell by 1.7 cents last week down to an average of \$2.53 for a gallon of regular unleaded, while the national average dipped 1.6 cents to \$2.84 per gallon, according to GasBuddy, which tracks daily gasoline pricing across the

While fuel prices remain the highest seasonally since 2014, gasoline costs are the lowest they've been since April. That downward trend is expected to continue for much of the rest of the year with the industry changeover away from the pricier summer-grade

Gasoline used in the summertime has a more expensive formulation designed to withstand evaporation

and additional wear and tear during the busier and hotter summer driving months.

In the meantime, looking at weather patterns, the income Hurricane Florence along the East Coast may cause some price spikes and temporary shortages in the region, but the Gulf Coast refining system in Texas and Louisiana won't be impacted, said Patrick DeHaan, head of petroleum analysis for GasBuddy.

"Hurricane season aside, gasoline demand will likely drift lower nearly countrywide, putting some additional downward impact on prices in most communities over the next few weeks," DeHaan added.Initially, Oxford and Smith were transported to the Clark County Detention Center and charged with one count of child abuse or neglect. 

(CNSNews.com) - The midterm election is about "safety and jobs," President Trump told a campaign rally in Montana Thursday night. He said the economy is "booming like never before," and on Friday, the unemployment report brought the president more good news: the unemployment rate for African Americans, 6.3 percent, is the second lowest on record (it was 5.9 percent in May); and job-growth remains strong.

For Hispanics, the unemployment rate increased two-tenths of a point from last month's record low of 4.5 percent. And the overall unemployment rate remained at a low 3.9 percent.

The number of jobs added -- 201,000 -exceeded analysts' expectations. (After revisions, job gains have averaged 185,000 for each of the last three months.)

After three straight record-setting months, the number of employed Americans dropped by 423,000 in August, to 155,542,000 from last month's all-time high of 155,965,000. This number has set 11 records since Donald Trump took of-



In August, the nation's civilian noninstitutionalized population, consisting of all people age 16 or older who were not in the military or an institution, reached 258,066,000. Of those, 161,776,000 participated in the labor force by either holding a job or actively seeking one.


The 161,776,000 who participated in the labor force equaled 62.7 percent of the 258,066,000 civilian noninstitutionalized population, slightly below last month's 62.9 percent participation rate.

The participation rate remains stubbornly low as a growing number of people leave the labor force, led by baby-boom retirees.

BLS noted that the percentage of Americans not in the labor force -- meaning they neither have a job nor are looking for one -- increased to a record 96,290,000 in August.

Among the major worker groups, the unemployment rates for adult men (3.5 percent), adult women (3.6 percent), teenagers (12.8 percent), Whites (3.4 percent), and Asians (3.0 percent) showed little or no change in August.



And there's positive news on wage growth: In August, average hourly earnings for all employees on private nonfarm payrolls rose by 10 cents to \$27.16. Over the year, average hourly earnings have increased by 77 cents, or 2.9 percent.

the month of August, besting laggards like retail and manufacturing, according to the latest government jobs report.

CNBC analyzed the net changes by industry for August based on the data from the Labor Department, which found that the U.S. economy created 201,000 jobs last month, more than the 191,000 estimated increase from economists surveyed by Reuters.

The professional and business services sector tied with the education and health sector for the largest net employment gains for the month, with increases of 53,000 jobs each. The manufacturing industry lost jobs for the first time since July 2017, though the total decline was just 3,000.



The loss comes after the sector added a strong 37,000 jobs last month, nearly matching June's 36,000 print. Motor vehicle and parts manufacturing contributed a decline of nearly 5,000 jobs.

To be sure, manufacturing employment has been on a hot streak in recent months, up 254,000 over the year, according to the Labor Department.

For the business sector, more than half came from hiring in professional and technical services such as accounting, bookkeeping and advertising.

In the education and health industry, medical providers like physicians, dentists and outpatient care clinics posted healthy numbers, with total ambulatory services adding 21,100 jobs over the month.



Transportation and warehousing also posted a strong month, adding 20,200 jobs. This industry includes jobs such as air, rail, water and truck transportation as well as warehousing and storage services.
